

Industry Certifications Return on Investment

This document is intended to inform parents and students about the potential cost savings associated with earning industry certifications before high school graduation. These savings are primarily realized through tuition and fee reductions resulting from postsecondary credits awarded via statewide articulation agreements.

In addition, students may earn industry certifications that do not directly translate into college credit. However, because the school district covers the cost of certification exam vouchers, families still benefit from significant financial savings.
